
Recitals by GLC-AGO Member Jeffrey Walker

DVD Review

Looking ahead to Christmas, here is a gift suggestion for a friend or yourself: *The Grand Organ of Liverpool Cathedral*.



On the DVD, cathedral organist Professor Ian Tracey gives a great overview of the instrument and its stops plus several other sections.

At the time it was installed in the cathedral, this 5-manual, 164-stop organ was the largest musical instrument in the world. If I were to pick my favorite instrument this one would be near the top of the list.

The concert portion can be watched and listened to on the DVD. The sound and video quality are excellent. For me, this is a "must have". It is available from Priory Records and also Amazon. The cost should be under \$50.

The Organ Experience

The Organ Media Foundation is pleased to announce its third internet streaming audio station, the Organ Experience (www.organexperience.com), which broadcasts classical organ music 24 hours a day. The station generates playlists grouped into 30-minute, 1-hour, or 2-hour blocks based on more than 80 different themes. Extensive information is included for each piece, including details about the composer, recording, and performer, and links to sheet music or free scores if the work is in the public domain. The Organ Media Foundation is a listener-supported 501(c)3 organization.
